Prez Sez

Since Connie is out of State this month, she asked that I do the May 2016 newsletter.

By Any measure, The April 9, 2016 outing was a huge success. April was scheduled as a dedicated Relic Hunt and listed as a TBA. At the time of scheduling during the December Board Meeting, we had not found or picked a location. Lorlria and Jerry had two locations in mind, however when they did the scouting of the locations, both were not accessible. During our April General Meeting Scott Sandahl stepped up and suggested Reefer City, which was an old mining encampment starting around the 1930s and later used by the military in the late 1940s. Located just a little south of Mojave, it made for a great "local" hunt. The only problem was the predicted rain storm due to pass through Saturday morning.

We all met Saturday morning at the park and ride located at Lancaster Blvd and Sierra Highway and departed in a caravan, with Scott and Renee as trail masters. After exiting at Silver Queen Road we briefly formed up for some instructions by Scott. Much to everyone's surprise and enjoyment, Scott provided a quick lesson on the history of Reefer City as well as a description of several potential hunt locations. Then he announced that he had put together Scavenger Hunt List of some very easy finds and that each find had a point value. The members with the three highest total points would get a silver coin- 1st place a silver half dollar, 2nd and 3rd a silver quarter. Everyone present would get

a silver dime. As a late add on, he decided to include aluminum cans to the list, with Jay Ziegler taking possession of the cans to add to the Clubs Recycling Fund. Shortly after Scott's pre briefing, the starting gun sounded and we all headed west along Silver Queen Road in a coordinated attack on the remains of Reefer City.

Weather was absolutely perfect. When I left Acton it was raining, yet no rain in sight in Reefer City. Most got by with only a Hoodie Sweat Shirt. All the dirt roads were accessible with regular cars giving easy access to all the areas. The area where the encampment had been located was extremely trashy with nearly an overwhelming amount of old tin cans and other steel target. But that did not stop us. It was interesting to see the remains of tin cans likely dating back to the 1940/50s mixed in with the current models. Tin cans had been opened with some type of edged tool or knife, the old triangle shaped can opener of yester year and we even saw that some had the tops cut off at he rim seal joint. A great demonstration in the evolution and passing of time.

Other areas of interest were several abandoned mine shafts that had been closed off with structural steel and the remains of several structures. It was very apparent that many of the areas had been worked in recent times, a testament to that old saying, there's gold in them thar hills. In fact, Kim Holmes panned some of the tailings and found several flakes of gold!! I am guessing he dry panned, but maybe he can recount his adventure at the May General Meeting.

We all reconvened to hold court around 1pm at our original roadside starting point, with everyone laying out their finds for all to see and judge. The diverse amount of trash and unique finds was just amazing. Most obvious to me was the lack of coins recovered. A few members found a

few, but not much. I think everyone dug up at least one of the Scavenger Hunt Listed items. The list included Brass Cartridges- Largest and Most, Shot Gun Shells- Oldest and Most, Any Coin and points for the Most coins, the Oldest Coin, Most Unique Item and Best Find of the Day. There was a tie for Largest Brass cartridge between Dan, Scott and Kirk. There may have been a 4th, but I did not note it. Scott found the most Brass. Carl Found the oldest Shot Gun shell and Scott had the Most. Anna Found the most Coins and Scott found the oldest. Most Unique Find was a metal clamshell Mouse Trap (pictured below) found by Scott and the Best Find of the day went to Wes for his 1940/50's old flip top lighter (kinda like a Zippo) and a possible bronze rosette. The best overall: First Place was Scott, Second Place was Wes and Third Places went to Ana.

This was a great outing with sixteen members participating on picture postcard perfect day. A big thanks to Scott Sandahl, who planned and organized this very successful surprise event


