




3rd Quarter Scavenger Hunt

All Scavenger hunt finds will be turned in at the first monthly meeting following the quarter (1st qtr. April/2nd qtr. July/3rd qtr. October/4th qtr. January) No early turn-ins. All must be brought in at the meetings noted above. Quarters start Jan, 1, April 1, July 1, October 1 and end on the last day of the 3rd month of that quarter. Member that finds all 15 items will win a Silver Half Dollar. (If there is a tie, the winner will be decided by the cut of a deck of cards and runner-up will receive a Silver Quarter.) Display owner must be present to win. If all items are not found, the member finding the most will win a Silver Quarter. Members finding at least 10 items will get a Silver Dime.

Even if you don't have a water detector, there is plenty of park to hunt. This is a State Park and technically doesn't allow metal detecting, but they have never stopped us from hunting the grounds or water. PLEASE cover your dig holes well so that it looks like nobody ever dug there. This will keep us in good standing so that we can continue to enjoy detecting this park.

Take I-5 to Lake Hughes Rd. and go east to Ridge Route Rd. and turn left. Turn right on to Castaic Lake Dr. then turn right to enter the park. There is a fee. After paying, turn left and drive to parking area 11. There are restrooms and shaded picnic tables in this area and usually less crowded.

This is a BYO food outing for metal/lake detecting.




Remember, as with the recycling collection, the proceeds from the sale of apparel are put back in the club to fund prizes and food at the outings.
