
FROM THE EDITOR:



Take CA-14 S to Santa Clarita. Merge onto I-5 N; Use the right 2 lanes to take exit 172 for West 126/Newhall Ranch Road toward Ventura; Use the left 3 lanes to turn left onto CA-126 W/State Hwy 126 W; Continue on US-101 N to S Seaward Ave. Take exit 68 from US-101 N; Merge onto US-101 N; Take exit 68 for Seaward Ave; Drive to Pierpont Blvd; Use any lane to turn left onto S Seaward Ave; Turn right onto Pierpont Blvd; Turn left to stay on Pierpont Blvd. Frequently the booth at the entrance is not staffed. Follow the road to the main parking lot.
