

From the Editor ...

Well, I for one, have taken a break from metal-detecting for the last few weeks. I tried to go to Sorensen Park last month but there was a Sheriff's deputy there. He was chasing four other people out of the park so I didn't even get out of the car.



I tried Murray park in Littlerock, there was a dog walker there and someone working in the office. I've never had any luck at that park and the wind was coming up so I left about thirty minutes and two dimes later.

Right after the last meeting in March and before the social shut down, I did make an exciting (to me) find. Goes to show, no matter what you might be looking for or where you are looking, you never really know what you might find. (See Page 2)

I grew up on an egg-producing chicken ranch in the A.V. It was several acres, with 5-6 large chicken houses and a brood house for chicks. It dated back to the 1930's at least. There was a main ranch house, some smaller houses where the ranch family lived and many cottages that were rented out. All of the buildings including the foundations were bulldozed over 25 years ago and the property remains mostly empty. Because I lived there, I can still picture where the buildings and driveways were.

I've gone there a couple of times and metaldetected along the edges of the property, I always thought it would be a great place to find some old silver coins. In the first week of March, before the lockdown, I decided to stop there for thirty minutes or so on my way home from park hunting. Now keep in mind, this is a dumpsite, with remains of broken concrete, tiny metal pieces, old plumbing pieces, etc. I thought that a silver coin might stand out against the cacophony of trash.

I found a 1972 penny, a wheatie and an old padlock in the first twenty minutes. I had several silver signals that turned out to be bits of scrap metal. Then I got a high penny signal; 78-79 on my AT Max. This is usually a penny, a dime or occasionally a silver ring or charm. I dug about 4" down after scraping away the debris on top. I pulled up a dirt clod and thought it was a washer at first, but I couldn't have been more shocked - It was a ring!!

I don't really know what to make of. It might be junk, but what I think it is possibly, is an old German silver Native American ring. It is well made, with a clear faceted stone, but has no markings at all. The area around and under the stone is very dirty despite my best efforts. It may have been in the ground for 80 years or could have been lost by a construction worker during the demolition. Who knows?

I lived there over sixty years ago. There's always a mystery to the treasures we find— who did it belong to, where did they get it? How did it come to be lost? What led me to that spot in an acre of trash? I wonder....




