





Head East out of Palmdale on Avenue S or Palmdale Blvd. & go South at 47th Street East (Highway 138 is still closed between Sierra Highway and 50th Street east!) or you can head east out of Lancaster and turn south on 50th Street East. Continue south on 47th (50th curves into 47th just before Palmdale Blvd.) which joins Hwy. 138 at Avenue T. Continue East on Hwy. 138 to 116th Street East, where the highway curves to the left into Pearblossom. The Outpost is at the curve on the right, you can't miss it.
