



July Outing — July 17, 2021 CASTAIC LAKE LAGOON

Directions

Exit the I-5 at Lake Hughes road, turn right onto Lake Hughes Road and drive about ½ mile to the Ridge Route Road, turn left on Ridge Route Road and drive north for about ½ mile to Castaic Lake Drive and turn right. Follow Castaic Lake Drive for about ¼ mile the turn right at the entrance road to the lake. Look for the entry tollbooth. The entry fee is \$11 per car (Ask about Senior or Handicap discount) After entering, make the first right turn and follow the access road to Parking Area 2. From this parking area, the concrete path leading to the beach areas can be used. If you park elsewhere, the beaches can accessed via uneven ground of wither hard dirt or grass.
