PRIZES: Rick and Vickie will be purchasing the prizes for the hunts. The prizes for the chili contest will be the usual assortment.

RULES FOR MAKING CHILI: Chili MUST be cooked from scratch on site (canned goods may be used, i.e. beans and tomatoes, etc.) but no canned chili that has been doctored up!) If you don't have a trailer or RV with a kitchen, please bring something to cook it on, i.e. Coleman Stove.

CHRISTMAS PARTY: The price of the party has gone up. Medrano's has raised their deposit from \$200 to \$300 and the price per person has gone up from \$22 to \$29. Historically, the club has covered the portion over the \$15 but the board has agreed (and members at hand voted) to raise the price for the party from \$15 to \$20 per person with the club continuing to cover the \$9 overage (formerly \$7). While some people may take issue with that, remember how much a single meal at a fast food restaurant can cost you these days! We need 50 reservations in order to get the deposit back. 



This month's outing is the annual October Chili Cook off and Club Hunt at Rocky Road. The campsite is located approximately 34 miles northeast of Mojave, along Highway 14.

The turn off is an easily passable dirt road. Last Chance Canyon Road, on the right as you travel north. There are two large billboards just before the turn off, one on each side of the highway.

Go to the Internet and google Maps and do a search for n35 30 2.80, w117 56 5601. This will give you a better idea of the locations. The actual campsite is about 3/4 of a mile in from the highway.

Be sure to bring chairs and plenty of water


