The Gold Mine by Linda Reitz

When I was in high school, my sister's brother-in-law, AI, had a gold mine at Red Mountain near Randsburg.

He actually lived in the mine. It was closed in, with a front door to the entrance of the horizontal shaft. The main shaft went back deep into the mountain but there were small rooms carved out of the rock to the left and right. As you entered, to the left there was a kitchen with table and chairs, ice box refrigerator and wood stove ventilated to the outside. We occasionally visited and took supplies to him. We would play cards at the table and listen to his stories. We slept on army cots in the small cave rooms and listened to the scurry of mice and packrats during the night.

You might not think the average six-teen year old high school girl would enjoy this kind of adventure but I grew up with my dad and uncle being miners. I was surrounded with talk of gold and minerals and went to the desert with them often as a kid. My uncle was a full time miner who had several claims in the Barstow and Daggett areas. He was given a discharge from the Army to mine for the government in the war years. He and my father grew up in the Mogollon mining area of New Mexico. He also worked for Knott's in the transformation of Calico Ghost town into a tourist attraction. My father gave me a beautiful amethyst crystal concretion which I had for quite a time. Also, a polished Onyx stone which I've had since I was eight years old.

So, spending the night in a cave never seemed unusual to me. During the summer, it might be 105 degrees outside but it was always nice and cool inside the mine. Unfortunately, life inside of a mine isn't very healthy. Al passed away at a fairly young age of Black Lung Disease, common to miners. My sister, for many years, had a large gold nugget that he gave her. It would probably be worth a bundle now if she still had it. Just a Reminder


